5 WAYS TO FEWER PUPPY ACCIDENTS TODAY

Simple moves you can start this afternoon, so you can get your home back.



Your puppy is not being bad and you are not failing. A young puppy has a tiny bladder and no routine yet, so accidents are normal. Here are five things that work, starting right now. **Do them consistently and the accidents drop fast.**

1

Take them out on a schedule

Go out after every nap, meal, drink, and play session, plus first thing in the morning and last at night. A rough guide: puppies can hold it about one hour for each month of age.

2

Use one spot and one cue word

Take your puppy to the same spot on a leash and say a short cue like "Go potty" as they start. Same door, same spot, same words every time.

3

Reward the second they finish

Praise big and give a treat right after they go, while you are still outside, not when you come back in. Timing is everything.

4

Prevent accidents

When you cannot watch closely, use a right-sized crate or small pen. Dogs avoid soiling where they sleep, so it helps them hold it until the next trip out.

5

Clean with an enzyme cleaner

Wipe accidents with an enzymatic pet cleaner so no scent is left to pull them back to the spot. Never scold or rub their nose in it.



NEVER DO THIS

Do not punish accidents, clean with ammonia-based products (the smell mimics urine), or give your puppy the run of the house too early. Calm and consistent wins.
